

<u> ACWW—Our Project in Sierra Leone</u>

How are you doing with your fund raising for our adopted Sierra Leone project? At the moment the main activities being carried out by the Amutor Calvary Sierra Leone are the creation of a rice farm and vegetable garden. Without support, they will not only be able to provide food for their families, it will enable them to network with different women's groups so they can exchange experiences unite forces in order to achieve bigger goals and develop self-sufficiency so they can have the dignity of being able to care and provide for their children. Our project will run until 1st November 2013 when the Public Affairs team hope to meet some of you in WI house in order to thank you for your efforts and generosity in raising money for such a worthwhile cause. ACWW Workshop -I recently attended NFWI house in London for an ACWW Workshop. We were addressed by May Kidd, the ACWW World President, who gave us an insight into the work undertaken worldwide by ACWW and she spoke of its close involvement with United Nations. She had over the years monitored some of ACWW's projects as had one or two other members present. We had speakers on the various resolutions to be put forward this year at the Triennial Conference in India—eg Improvement in Maternal Health Services; the banning of Bisphenol A, a hazardous chemical; Stopping the practice of female genital mutilation; Forming an energy for all fund and e-waste recycling.
